Dear Parents,

Fr James parked his car in a 'no-parking' zone in the city because he was short on time and couldn't find a parking space with a meter. So he put a note under the windshield wiper that read: "I have circled the block ten times. If I don't park here, I'll miss my appointment. FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES!" When he returned, he found a parking fine along with this note: "I have been circling this block for 10 years. If I don't give you a ticket, I'll lose my job. LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION!"

This little story, although quite funny, leads us to focus our attention on The Lord's Prayer. It is one of the most common prayers, said and sung in millions of homes, churches and schools; often little attention goes into thought about WHAT we are actually praying. Our own Loreto learners stand in the quad every morning, saying the Lord's Prayer, and how beautiful it is to hear hundreds of children's voices ringing out to the Lord every morning.

There are many different theologies and ideas surrounding the actual interpretation of the Lord's Prayer, but essentially, it can be summed up as the following: The apparent meaning depicted in the words of Jesus in the Lord's Prayer, as a Christian's first and most ardent desire, is: (1) the glory of God (desiring that God's "will being done on earth" which is all encompassing), and (2) the happiness of man by His kingdom coming and (3) asks for no more of this world than daily bread (this would perhaps include occupation and health), longing meantime for the bread that came down from heaven and (4) whose only other desires are forgiveness of sins, as he heartily forgives others, and (5) sanctification (desiring to avoid wrongdoing). Based on the Bible commentary: "Notes on the Bible" by Wesley.

How often do we not ramble through this prayer, and give no thought to what the words really mean in our daily lives. We ask the Lord to forgive us, as we forgive those who have wronged us, however too often we go through our days, holding grudges against others and being angry. We hallow (make holy) the Lord's name, but often use it as a profanity just a little while later. We ask for our daily bread, yet seek earthly riches and possessions, instead of being thankful for the daily bread He has given already and, more importantly, seek out spiritual nourishment.

Give some thought today to the Lord's Prayer, and what is means in your life and in your daily dealings with others. The next time you speak this prayer, do it slowly, with thought and reflection.


Please do try to assist us in this regard so that we can effectively provide a great service to you!
